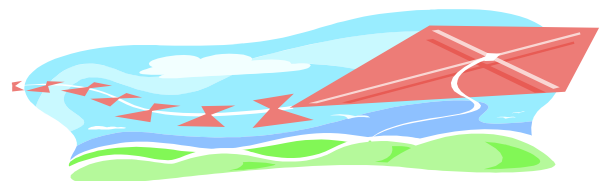

Dress Code

Parents,

As you begin to shop for clothes for the next year, please purchase clothes that adhere to our dress code. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

- I. The wearing of clothing that exposes the midriff or buttocks is not permitted.
- II. The wearing of pants or shorts below the waist is not permitted. Examples of dress not permitted: flip flops, tank tops, **spaghetti strap tops**, midriff shirts, low-cut tops, muscle shirts, clothing with inappropriate wording and short scanty shorts and skirts that do not extend beyond the students fingertips when the hands are held at his or her side. (The midriff should not be exposed.)
- III. Clothing with writing across the buttocks is not acceptable at Jackson School.
- IV. Upon entering the building, hats must be immediately removed.
- V. The wearing of hats, headbands, and head scarves while inside the building is not permitted. Head coverings worn for religious purposes are permitted.
- VI. The wearing of clothing/jewelry that exhibits references to drugs, alcohol, tobacco products, **violence**, sex, profanity, or gang-related activities is not permitted. In addition, excessive jewelry should not be worn as it may interfere with learning. Students may only wear one bracelet or wristband in school.
- VII. Proper footwear is required. Sandals and clogs should **not** be worn because of potential injury due to falling and ankle twisting.
- VIII. Jackets and coats may not be worn in the classrooms.
- IX. Students may be required to wear certain types of clothing while participating in physical education classes, shops, extracurricular activities, or other situations where special attire may be required to insure the health or safety of the student. Students may not bring make-up (including lipstick/gloss) to school.
- XI. Students have the responsibility to keep themselves, their clothes, and their hair clean. School officials may impose limitations on student participation in the regular instructional program where there is evidence that the lack of cleanliness constitutes a health hazard.
- XII. The wearing, possessing, using, distributing, displaying, or selling any clothing, jewelry, emblems, badges, symbols, signs, graffiti, or other items that are evidence of membership in or affiliation with a gang are not permitted.
- XIII. Students may bring backpacks to school, however, students must keep them in their lockers or with their coats during the school day. They are not authorized to carry them in the building during the day.
