

**Williamsport Area School District
Board of Directors Meeting - Tuesday, March 17, 2026**

1. Meeting Opening – The Regular Meeting of the Board of School Directors of the Williamsport Area School District of which all members were duly notified and of which due public notice was given as required by Act 84 of 1986, was held on Tuesday evening, March 17, 2026, beginning at 6:00 PM in the Board Room of the District Service Center, 2780 West Fourth Street, Williamsport, Pennsylvania.

5. Curriculum Report

5.1 Consider approving a Letter of Agreement with Merakey to ensure continuity of care for students receiving mental health services through their agency.

5.2 Consider approving a subscription for Sapphire Software: School Nurse Health System for a district-wide license. The annual license and subscription agreement will be for three years (2026-2027, 2027-2028, and 2028-2029). The cost of \$10,905 per year is to be paid from the Student Services budget.

5.3 Consider approving an amended agreement with the Champions Before and After School Care Program for use at Hepburn Lycoming Primary School, Cochran

Primary School, and Jackson Primary School for the provision of Before and After School Childcare for the 2026-27 school year. The program will use the facilities at

Hepburn Lycoming, Cochran Primary, and Jackson Primary as defined in the agreement to begin on June 10, 2026. This program is a direct advantage to school district families, and the waiver of fees is requested to use the facilities.

- 5.4 Consider approving up to 1,115 summer professional development days K-12 for curriculum development, data team meetings, technology integration, new teacher on-boarding, SWPB, and QBS training. Per the WEA agreement, teachers will be paid \$150 per full day and \$75 per half day. These days will be paid through the Assistant Superintendent, Human Resources, Student Services, Special Education, Federal Programs, and Secondary Curriculum budgets.
- 5.5 Consider awarding the bid for the Welding System Simulator to Airgas USA, LLC of Allentown, PA with the purchase of a Miller AugmentedArc Augmented Reality Welding System simulator at a cost of \$32,529.54. This equipment will be utilized by students in the Welding Technology program to gain a thorough understanding of state mandated industry competencies through an innovative technological approach. The equipment purchase will be funded through a combination of funding from both the First Community Foundation Partnership and the Williamsport Area School District Education Foundation.
- 5.6 Consider approving the following payment for an additional musician for Hadestown: Teen Edition to be held at the Williamsport Area High School on March 27-28, 2026. This payment is funded through the Williamsport Area High School music budget.
- 5.7 Consider approving the purchase and adoption of the Amplify ELA core program for Grades 7-8 in the district at a cost of \$164,845. The cost for the student and teacher materials will be funded through the general fund. Included in the price is 6 years of licensing, student and teacher materials, and professional development.
- 5.8 Consider approving the purchase of sixteen (16) APC Smart-UPS 3000 w/network cards, sixteen (16) APC External Battery Packs SRT96RMBP, nine (9) APC Smart-UPS 5000, twelve (12) External Battery Packs SRT192RMBP, and nine (9) APC Step-Down Transformers from Trebron IT and Cybersecurity, Lancaster, PA at a cost of \$214,114.58. This equipment was competitively bid through the E-Rate PEPPM Mini Bid process, and all equipment is eligible for an 85% discount rate after acquisition of all equipment. Trebron's PEPPM number is 528897-251 and eRate SPIN 142053861. Costs will be paid through Technology Reserves.
