- Applications are due in the Counseling Office by March 22nd, 2019. This deadline will be adhered to strictly! All supporting documents must be included.

- 2. Copy of SAT/ACT scores from College Board or from transcript
- 3. True copies of the parent & the student 1040 Federal tax Forms *
- 4. Copies of the W-2 Tax Forms for the parent & student. *
- 5. Complete the FAFSA and attach the summary sheet showing your Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
