Warm Weather Dress

Please remember: If the clothing of your child is inappropriate for school to the point of interfering with the educational process, (for example where other students are distracted from learning, or the teacher is distracted from doing his/ her job in an effective manner), the child may be asked to change their clothing. Dress that is inappropriate for school may include, but may not be limited to: short shorts, halter tops, spaghetti straps, high heeled or floppy shoes without a back, and tight or revealing clothing. If shorts are worn on very warm days, they must be at least mid-thigh in length. Shoes must be appropriate to avoid a safety hazard on stairs and the playground. Remember, no flip flops or footwear that does not have backing. Footwear worn to school must be held to a student's heel by at least a **strap.** Information on the dress code for school is in the student handbook.
