INTRODUCTION TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Course Code: CJA 1100-190

Description: An introduction to the field of criminal justice and its major components, roles and functions. Emphasis is placed upon concepts of law and the historical descriptive analysis of the police, courts, and corrections.

PRINCIPLES OF ACCOUNTING I

Course Code: ACC 1110-190

Description: Introduces the fundamentals of accounting, which is “the language of business.” The course covers the accounting cycle, balance sheet and income statement preparation, and internal controls. Other topics include accounting for cash, receivables, merchandise inventory, plant assets and intangibles, and ethics.

Credits: 3 credits

Notes: This course is required by the A.S. Business Administration, all B.S. Business Administration concentrations (Accounting, Management and Marketing) and the B.M. Music: Music Business degree programs.

UNITED STATES HISTORY TO 1877

Course Code: HST 2201-190

Description: A survey of American history covering pre-European contact through colonization, independence, and the formation of the new republic; nationalism, sectionalism, and the growth of democracy in the 19th century; and the Civil War and Reconstruction.

Credits: 3 credits
