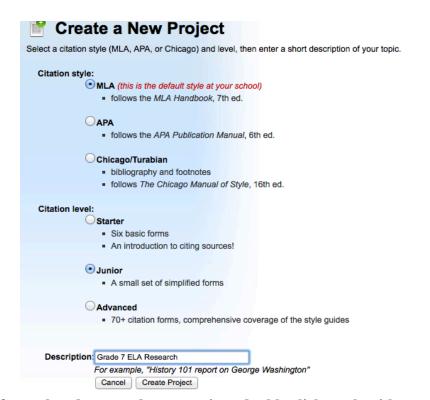

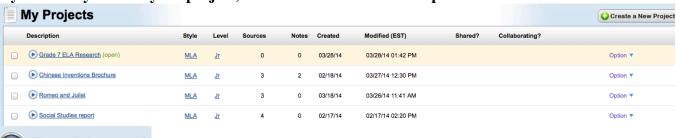
- 2. Use your school ID and password for the username and password.
- 3. Click Sign In.



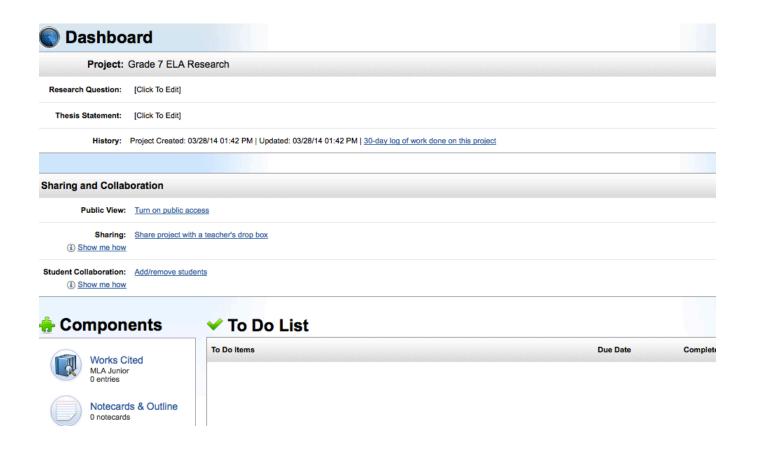
- 1. Citation Style: Keep MLA.

Creating a Citation

Click **Bibliography** at the top of the screen.



Using the drop box choose your citation type (web site) and click **Create Citation**.

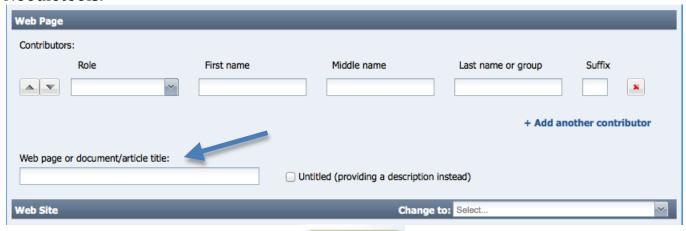


Citing a website with no citation listed.

Click onto your webpage. Find the name of the web site (usually at the top left). Copy and paste it into Name of the Web Site in NoodleTools. Look carefully at web site to see if you can find the person or organization that made the web site (the publisher). Copy and paste that into Publisher of the site. Do not change the date of access unless you go to it on a later date. Look for a date on the web site if you can find one and enter it in date of e-publication in NoodleTools. Highlight and copy the URL (www. ____) of the website and paste it into the box in NoodleTools for the URL.



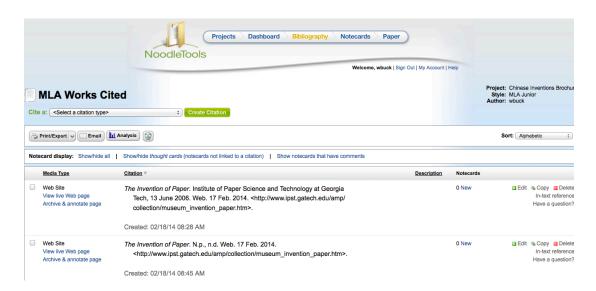
Now look for the name of the web page (the article) and copy and paste it into Noodletools.



Submit

Then at the top or bottom of the page click onto the MLA Works Cited page.

Citing a website with a citation listed under the article.

Using the drop box choose your citation type (web site) and click Create Citation.



Then click **Continue** as shown below.

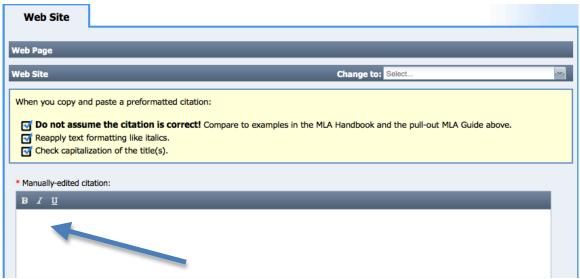


A citation is sometimes provided **below** the article. Always choose **MLA** for the citation type if there is a choice.

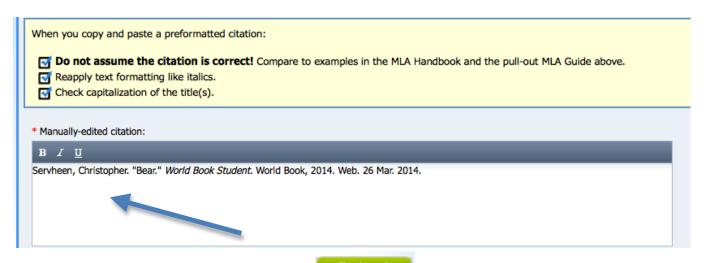
In Noodletools click **Copy & paste a citation**.



Click into the box labeled **Manually-edited Citation**.

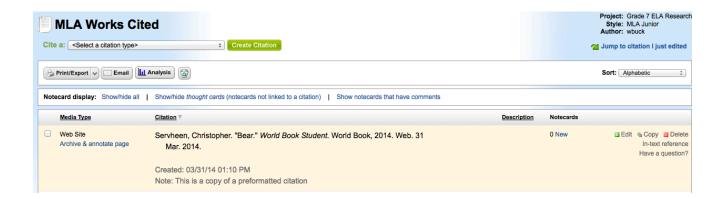


On the webpage highlight and copy (Command C) the citation. Be sure to choose **MLA** if there is a choice. Go back to NoodleTools and paste the citation using Command V in Manually-edited citation. See below.



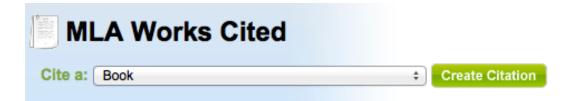
Then at the top or bottom of the page click onto the MLA Works Cited page.

Citing a Book

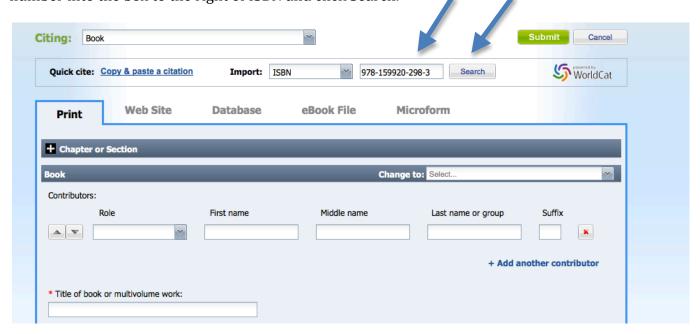
Using the drop box select book and click **Create Citation**.



Click Continue.

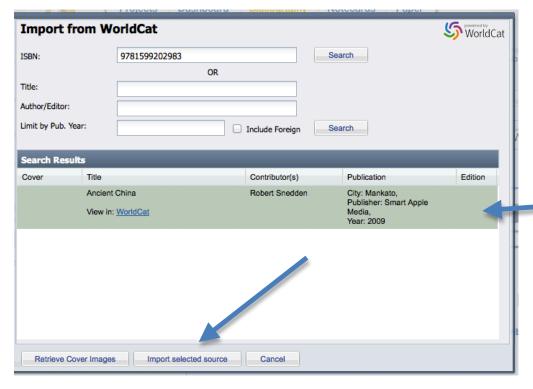


Locate the ISBN number on the back of the book or on the back of the title page of the book. Type the number into the box to the right of ISBN and click Search.



Import selected source at the bottom of

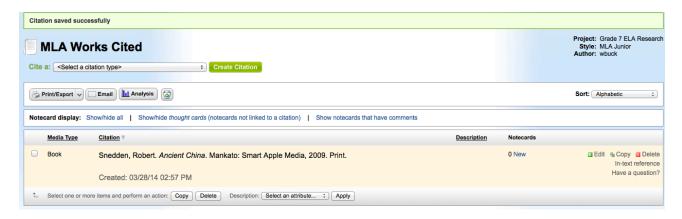
Click once on the search results. (See below). Then, click the screen.



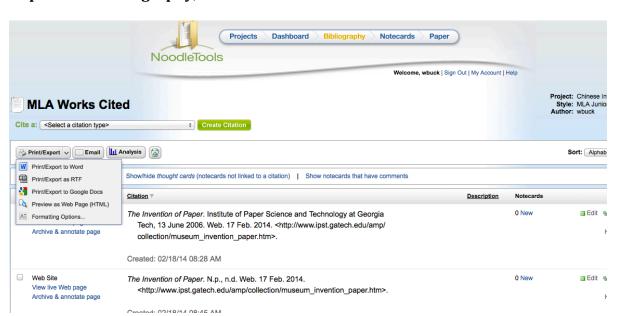
Then, click at the bottom of the next screen which will add the citation to the MLA Works Cited page.
